FROM THE PRESIDENT’S DESK:

Hello all. Two more months and we will again be busy with our events. I am looking forward to the San Diego Tour de Cure on Saturday 21 April. It is always a pleasure to meet with everyone and ride together again. Mijo and I will probably ride/drive down on Friday evening and find a place to stay near the start. It is a good distance from here in Rialto to the area that we will be riding in, so it is much safer to ride down in the daylight on Friday than to try to get up early Saturday and make the trip. More to follow on the start location and where we will stay later. Also, don’t forget that the Ship to Shore ride will be two weeks later on Sunday April 29th.

The third week of January, we had a couple of bad wind days here in Rialto. The top section of my HF antenna broke in the wind (again). I had repaired it once. Now I am afraid that it will be too short if I try the same repair a second time. I guess it is time to look into a long wire and an antenna tuner, or perhaps something else that might stand up to our wind. I would like to have a good beam, like Alvin, KD6UZM, but it probably wouldn’t last a season here. Well, the loss of the HF isn’t too bad as I haven’t turned it on since Mijo and I returned from France last fall.

The wind also managed to destroy my garage door. Just flexing in the wind cracked two of the four 16 foot long panels that make up the bigger of the two doors. I have contacted several shops to get estimates on repairing this door or replacing booth. Seems that the doors I now have are obsolete (no longer made), so my only option is to replace. Now, to get a couple of more bids and decide who will get the job.

The first of the year we changed the reward for listening to the MARC net. Mijo and I will continue to draw a name/call sign, for each week, at the monthly MARC meeting; those who checked in to the weekly net and are present at the meeting will win \$5.00 worth of 50-50 tickets from the 50-50 lady. I will be able to entertain early check-ins from Illinois and Florida without them having to wait till 10 or 11 at night (their time) to check in.

Someone in Texas could let us know what they are doing to prepare for the Texas MS 150 Jerry, K5JEI, has written a post from his perspective, but, with all the riders, and motorcyclists a look at the ride from a participant’s side would be most interesting.

I did get my 2001 Goldwing in for the recall on the brakes. The service department at Huntington Honda had it in and out in about fifteen minutes. Thanks for a super job guys. If you haven’t done yours yet, don’t delay. It is free and, if they have the part in stock, very quick. I also need to make an appointment to have my cooling system checked. When I start the ‘Wing after sitting for a day or two, I can smell the “sweet” odor of anti-freeze evaporating from the engine area. This happened once before. It was a minor leak at the top radiator hose on the left side. My suspicion is that once again I have a leak caused by the expansion of coolant in the engine when I turn off a hot engine. The extra pressure will squeeze out just a few drops of coolant; time to get it fixed before it becomes a big leak. No need to overheat and be stranded somewhere on the road.

Our next MARC meeting will be Saturday, 11 February 1012 at the Home Town Buffet on 17th Street in Santa Anna, CA. Join us if you can! We will be there at 7AM to set up the room for our meeting (if you come to help, remember we must stay out of the food service area) and they open the doors for food service at 7:30. I will try to start our meeting at 8AM. This is a self service, all you can eat buffet, so feel free to return to the food service area for seconds at any time.

Fundraising had already begun, and teams of riders are signing up. To date, this year is slightly ahead of last year in terms of teams, money raised so far, and sponsors. It was announced that Wahoo Tacos will be providing the lunch this

year. The goal for this year is to raise \$ 1,000,000 from this event. It can be done with some hard work, so MARC will have to be prepared. There may be as many as 3,000 riders this year. More will be known as the April 29 event gets closer. Please volunteer for this event as we will need many riders, as well as net control and support and SAG's.

There is a little bit of bad news however. We were told after last year's event that there would be more support for the notorious railroad tracks. I have been told officially that there will not be much more done than last year which meant a few cones out in the middle of the street. I will push to get some large signs made if possible. But I am also open to suggestions by MARC members if there is anything that we can do to help with this dangerous spot. Discussed last year was a Caltrans sign, plywood, and even police patrol at the spot, but it does not look like that will happen. So be prepared to discuss it at the next meeting.

I am not sure that I will be able to make the meeting on Sat, Feb 11, 2012. I am scheduled to have eye surgery on the 7th of Feb, and do not know if I will be able to drive to Santa Ana.

February being Heart Awareness month:

- Only 13 percent of women view heart disease as a health threat, even though it's women's No. 1 killer.
- Cardiovascular disease (CVD) kills nearly half a million women a year, about one per minute.
- CVD claims more lives than the next six most common causes of death combined.
- On average, an American dies of CVD every 34 seconds.
- Coronary heart disease is the No. 1 killer of women over age 25.
- Sixty-four percent of women who died suddenly of coronary heart disease had no previous symptoms.
- One in 2.5 women will die of heart disease or stroke, compared with one in 30 from breast cancer.
- Heart disease rates in post-menopausal women are two to three times higher than in pre-menopausal women of the same age.
- Stroke is the No. 3 cause of death for American women, and is a leading cause of serious, long-term disability.
- Stroke kills more women than men. In 2002, females represented nearly 62 percent of stroke deaths.

January 31st. I had in the back of my mind to get out early and go for a ride. No big deal IF you live among the members of MARC in the southern climates. However this is Minnesota and usually we have lots of snow and ice. Usually or 98% of the time we are still warming ourselves by the ice fishing holes on a lake. Not this year! More cars are dropping thru the ice as people.. well sometimes we don't think! Expected high for today at the Airport was 41... at 230pm its 45. however that is the unofficial temperature. Dirty ice on the lakes. Freezing and then thawing and then well you get the idea.

Filled the gas tank on the beemer back in December and drove it home. Never know when the January Thaw would be coming! First Week in the new year the temps shot up into the 40's! Finally on the 8th I took the first Ride and found my way back from Wisconsin.

January 10th the official temp was 52.. however as I rode by the local bank the temp there was 58.

Well anyway... I removed the battery tender from the black RS and pushed it out on the tarmac... err driveway. Water dripping and running down the alley... Bike was running until I put down the side stand. Walked back into the garage and readjusted the tender on the 85 BMW K. Closed the garage door and blipped the throttle while checking the mirrors.

Gently rode south to 37th. The roads are white with salt residue and rode west to Hwy 47, north to the freeway 694 and took the loop east and south to 94 then west thru St. Paul and then on to Minneapolis. Noticed the odometer read 112233. Left lane of 94 waiting for the Mercury Cougar to react to the headlight. Finally opened the throttle and well you know.

My nephew in Texas had told me he rode on Sunday for 110 miles. Sent a text to him that for January its 165 which he responded of doing 350+.

"Oh you will catch him, Tim." Karen smiled.

"Yep Justin has taken January, but how much will he ride this summer is the question!"

Weather people have short memories. Most of them are stunned with the heat wave. And yet the records that we are breaking are from the late 1800's. Mean temperature is around 24 degrees or we are in 8th place for the warmest January.

Back in 1999/2000 the weather was similar. Now rain would be nice or moisture as we are in a drastic drought!

US House Committee Targets Federal Funding of Motorcycle Only Roadside Checkpoints

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation reports that Wednesday, February 1st, the United States House of Representatives Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure rolled out the latest version of the highway bill. The bill is the long term funding bill for road construction and highway programs.

This version of the bill takes aim at a controversial practice of the Department of Transportation which funded motorcycle-only roadside checkpoints with taxpayer dollars.

The checkpoints have drawn much criticism from the motorcycle community at large. So much so, that longtime motorcycle champion Representative James Sensenbrenner (R-WI) had introduced legislation to end the program by prohibiting any future Federal funding of any motorcycle-only roadside checkpoints. That bill is HR 904. The mammoth highway bill includes the same language as contained in HR 904.

Representative Sensenbrenner had this to say, "We need to focus on proven methods of motorcycle safety, including crash prevention, rider education, and training and proper licensing. Motorcycle-only checkpoints are an intrusive governmental overreach that place an undue burden on riders while doing little to actually improve safety," He added, "It is encouraging to see that the transportation reauthorization bill will encourage more efficient use of taxpayer dollars and smart motorcycle safety policy."

Representative Tom Petri (R-WI), a staunch defender of the motorcyclists, had this comment on the issue, "Motorcycle riders are right to be outraged at being singled out for safety inspections," Petri said. "Nobody is suggesting flagging cars down for unscheduled inspections, and there's no good reason why motorcycles should be treated differently. It's unnecessarily intrusive, and not a smart way to use limited police resources."

We at the MRF could not agree more. While swift passage into law is not likely, this is certainly an encouraging step.

The MRF will keep you updated on this issue.

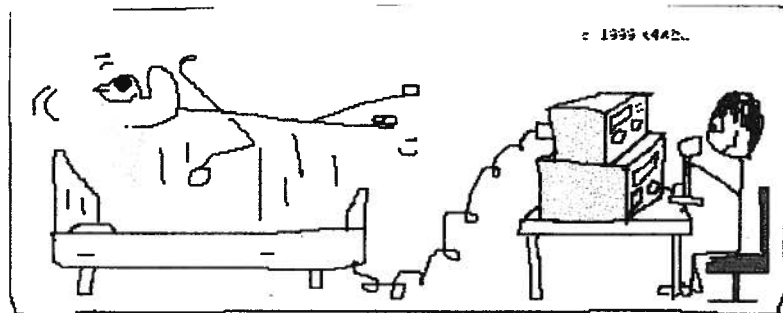

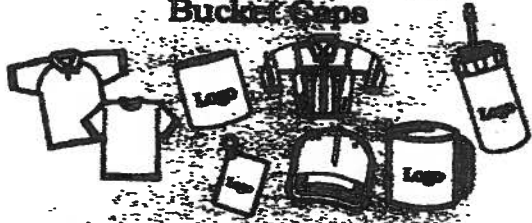

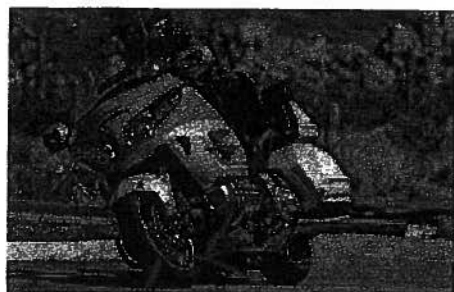
