It is also the start of our MARC riding season. I and all of the MARC officers need your help! Please come to the MARC meeting at the Home town Buffet on Saturday 11 March 2017. We will get our last briefing for the Bike MS, Coastal Challenge. This is a MS ride starting and ending at the Rose Bowl on Saturday 25 March 2017. This is a new event for MARC but not for the MS group. They have four routes, all going east from the Rose Bowl. The longest is the 100 mile that will go up the Azusa Canyon and across the Glendora Mountain Ridge, and back down Mount Baldy. This is the same basic route that the ADA has proposed for their ride later this spring. It should be a good primer for our group. I hope this spring rainy weather will be over by the end of March. I and the rest of the MARC Board need all Southern California MARC members to help with this, our first event of the year. Motorcycle mobile, SAG, and net control radio operators are all needed.

At this month's MARC meeting we will be discussing our 25th anniversary meeting and what we should acquire (treasury permitting) for that meeting. So far the vote has been for a new radio, either mobile or a handi. After all, we are a motorcycling radio club

and the motorcycle thing would be a bit over the top. I would like to have input from a few more of our members so please stop by and put your ideas in the hat.

With the wind and rain that we had for the end of January and most of February I have made just a couple of short rides in the local area. I have spent most of my time in the recliner, helping Mijo with the grandchildren, and working on other tasks at the local American Legion post. A friend had given me an old flux-core wire feed welder, which I had been using to construct gate frames for my son's backyard. Well, the old welder took a powder so I found a new one on sale and acquired the unit. It works much better than the old one and should make finishing the gates for my son and also a new gate for the Legion post patio a much easier task. I also had to buy a new battery for my lawn mower, got it running and now I need to spread a good coat of weed & feed over the yard to prep the grass for spring. Now a short word on safety. If your motorcycle has been sitting in the garage for a few weeks (as has mine) due to our spate of bad weather, give it a good once over before taking it out for a ride. Check the tires, air pressure, brakes, oil and other fluids, and give it a well needed wash job. That will give you a good look at the rest of the cycle to check for loose or missing parts. It only takes a few minutes to make sure that your next ride is a safe one.

This past Sunday was the kick off party for the American Diabetes Association Tour de Cure LA held at the Pomona Valley Mining Co restaurant. It was a great location with a great view, and plenty of finger food and Champagne. There were several guests and speakers, and they showed off all the routes and Jerseys that are new for this year. There will be a 11 mile route, 26 mile route, 40 mile route, 51 mile route, 60 mile route and a 100 mile route. All of these routes are on the same basic streets, and all them are an "out and back". There will also be a 5k and 10k run that will be timed for the runners. The bicyclists are doing a ride, not a race and will not be timed. There will also be a classic car show at the beginning venue at Santa Fe Dam Recreational area lake. This will be a fun event even for those that are not riding or running. They also passed out buttons that read: Ask me about the Dam ride. Marc will need many motors and SAGS to cover this event, so PLEASE keep SATURDAY, JUNE 10 open so you can work this event. (yes, it will be on a Saturday this year). Much of the riding will be on historic Route 66, and they are hoping to have many old cars and such at some of the rest stops along the way. Since this is an out and back event, it should be

more fun and less pressure for MARC, as we will be passing each other quite often. And for those who wish to work the mountain portion of the event, (40,60,100 mile routes), there will much less riders than on the flat areas, and we will have the fun/challenge of some twisty mountain roads. I just wish I could put Net Control on wheels for this event and actually ride along with you!!

More to come next month, so please stay tuned. Remember, please ask anyone that you know who rides but is not a MARC member, or anyone who would like to work as a SAG, ham or not that we would love to have them come out and help us. WE can keep them in touch using cell phones and text messaging.

MS COASTAL CHALLENGE (Start & Finish at the Rose Bowl MARCH 25th, 2017

The MS Coastal Challenge ride is coming up in about a month. It runs on March 25 and will be a full day event.

I would like everyone interested in volunteering for this event to sign up for the MS Coastal Challenge ride (see link below). Although this is a new ride for MARC, it is with a same Multiple Sclerosis Society we have supported for many years.

This event will have about 1000 bicycle riders and will start and end at the Rose Bowl. There are 33, 55, and 100 mile routes with a lot of overlap between them. The

route goes along the foothills as far East as Claremont.

The 100 mile route also extends up Hwy 39 from Azusa and across to Glendora Mountain Road and back down.

Because of the narrow roads and very few motorcycle-friendly turnouts in the loop through the hills we will patrol this area using SAGs only. As a result we will need a few more SAGs than normal.

In addition there is about eight miles of bicycle trail on this route. We will have at least one bicycle mobile rider on this section of the route, if you know of other bicycle mobile operators please forward this request to them.

The committee has had a couple of volunteer groups drop out of the event. They have several locations on the route where they need volunteers to help guide bicycle riders. If you know people that can help please let me know. They do not need to be amateur radio operators.

If you are available for this event please plan to attend the MARC meeting on March 11, 2017.

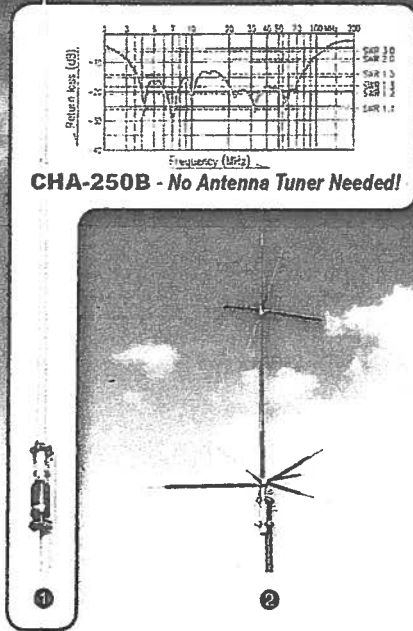

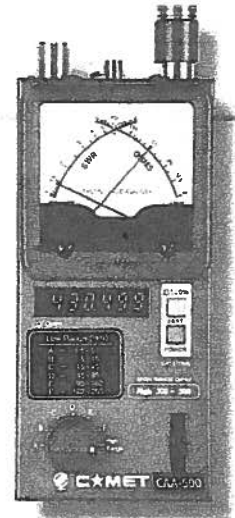

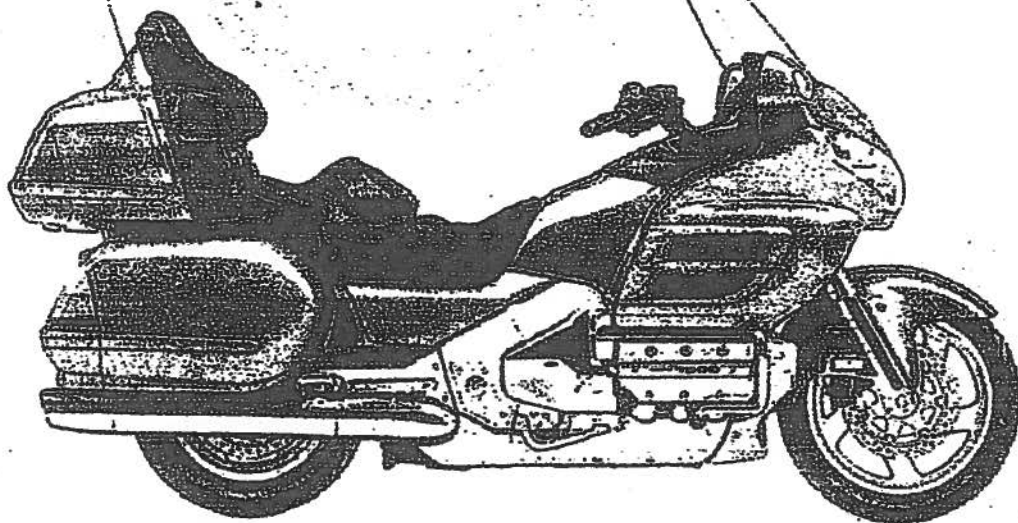
