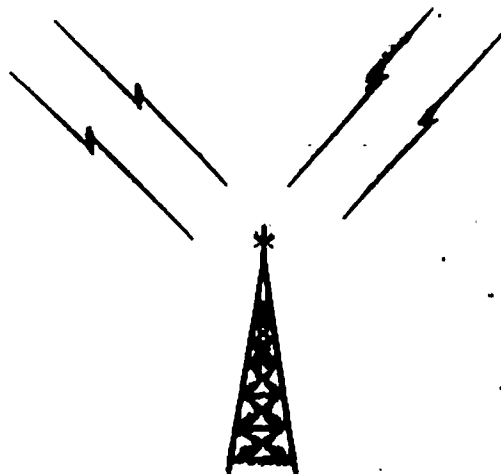

FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT:

With Christmas just around the corner I know everyone is really busy this month. December, to us at the Davis residence, is the busiest month of the year, by far. With shopping, Christmas cards to do, decorations for the house and all the other fun things to do, plus keeping up with our obligations to MARC. This newsletter almost did not get out. Those who said they were going to contribute articles this month, didn't, so it will be a short newsletter.

The November 21st "Scouts for Food" drive was very successful. MARC members provided communications and helped box food at collection sites 21, 22 & 23 (there were 25 collection points in Orange Co.) Site #21 took in over 1300 boxes of food, which equates to about 40,000 lbs of food, two semi-trailers were stuffed to capacity. That site was open from 9 A.M. to 6 P.M. and was the last to close as most all of the other sites closed between 3 & 4 P.M. or as food stopped arriving. Site 21 was at a Latter Day Saints church and we had between 30 & 50 volunteers working at all times. Church members, both Girl & Boy Scouts, Explorers and members of the local Fire Dept were all part of the volunteers. An estimated 500,000 lbs of food was collected that day. GREAT JOB ONE & ALL. Ray KD6FHN, DeWitt KM6UK and Billy N6EDY were those who participated. THANKS AGAIN FOR A JOB WELL DONE.

The MARC NETS on Wednesday nights continues to do well with approximately 40 check-ins for each NET. Thanks to Ron WB6ZEI our fine Net Controller. Ron will be on vacation for the December 23rd and 30th NETS. We are looking for a volunteer to fill in and if no one else comes forward to volunteer it looks like Ray KD6FHN will try his hand at it. Be patient and merciful, please. By the way, for those that can not make the Keller Peak Repeater for whatever reason on Wednesday nights during check-in, Ray will

take check-ins on 144.375 SIMPLEX as we used to do. However, on December 23rd and 30th while Ron is on vacation that will be next to impossible if Ray & Bonnie have to do the NET. We have the necessary equipment but while transmitting on SIMPLEX, it knocks out the reception from the repeater on the other radio. But will give it a try and see how it goes.

The MARC Saturday morning breakfast held November 14th had the largest turn out to date. There were 27 men & women present with 17 motorcycles all lined up together in a row behind Denny's restaurant. It was a beautiful sight to behold. All those motorcycles with Ham radio antennas on them. It was wonderful to see the ladies there, too. SO COME OUT AND JOIN THE FUN.

December 13th, the day after our MARC breakfast meeting, is the TOYS FOR ORANGEWOOD HOME FOR ABUSED CHILDREN motorcycle ride. MARC members will be providing communications and helping to coordinate this event. (SEE FLYER IN THIS NEWSLETTER). MARC members wishing to participate and provide help will meet in the parking lot at the Red Robin Restaurant 1/2 hour before sign-in begins for the other riders. We get a free breakfast (as do all other riders) official rider escort signs will be provided. That's MARC members at 7 A.M. at the Red Robin Restaurant Parking lot at El Camino Real and Jamboree. Which is about 1/4 mile North of the I-5 FWY on Jamboree. We already have six MARC members signed up to help with this worthy cause and the sign-up sheet will be at the Saturday December 12th breakfast meeting, too. If for some reason you cannot make the ride you can bring an unwrapped gift to the meeting and we (Ray & Bonnie) will see that it gets taken to the ride as we will be taking our trailer for the MARC donations. This final event for MARC members to work concludes a busy year for our young organization. It now appears that the next event that the MARC members will be working will be the American Honda Ride for the Children's Brain Tumor Center. That will be in March 1993. But, as we have experienced in the past, we could be called upon at anytime on short notice as more and more charity organizations discover the value of having motorcycles with ham radios added to their communication systems.

We are still getting phone calls and letters from amateur radio operators who have motorcycles asking to be put on our roster and mailing list. (Eight new members this month). Our mailing list is now up to 88, not bad for a club as unique as ours and only six months old.

De Witt KM6UK has not heard back from the American Red Cross, Orange Co chapter as yet concerning MARC's affiliation with them.

We are looking for guest speakers that would be of interest to MARC members at our Saturday morning breakfasts. If you would like to be one or you know of someone, let Ray know. Also we are always in need of articles for the newsletter. We should have these articles by the fourth Saturday of each month so we have time to place them.

The Keller Peak Repeater has installed the rebuilt controller and their new transmitter and receiver. The association is also in the process of adding a much larger set of back-up power batteries. If I remember correctly from

the last KPRA board meeting, these new, larger batteries could provide back-up power to the repeater for as long as 10 days to two weeks. The batteries are still being tested and charged and at this time are not installed at the repeater site.

Included is another KPRA application for your convenience. Joining the association helps towards the upkeep of the repeater maintenance.

None of the MARC activities (NETS or MEETINGS) will be discontinued during the holidays.

PRESS RELEASE

The Let's Talk Radio Network will be airing a special showcase of its programming. This three hour special presentation can be heard on November 1st at 3am Eastern/12am Pacific (late night October 31st).

The program will be live on WWCR on 7.435 MHz as well as on the station's regular satellite channel. LTRN can be found on Spacenet 3, Channel 21, 6.2 wide band audio. Current hours of operation are 5pm-1am Eastern Monday thru Friday and all day Saturday and Sunday. Twenty-four hour operation is planned for early next year.

LTRN features general interest and technical talk as well as programming suitable for air directly over Amateur Radio. Tune in Saturdays at 5pm Eastern for Amateur Radio Weekly with host Frank Collins-N6TAF. This two-hour program features taped segments such as Newslines and the Rain Dialup in the first hour, and a live call-in in the second hour with a guest.

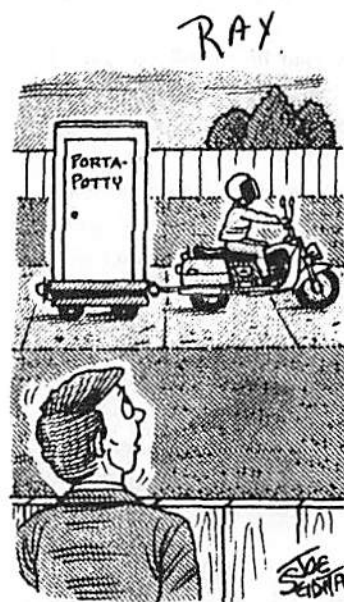

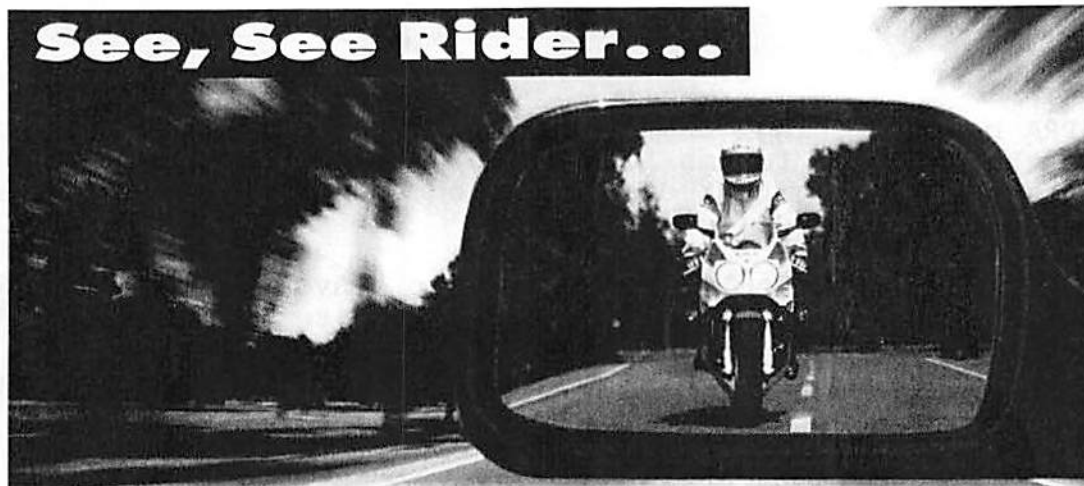

New Motorcyclist Awareness Billboard Design Unveiled

The CMSP has produced a new billboard design to attract motorists' attention. The billboards will begin appearing in late 1992 and 1993 in Northern and Southern California. Reproduced above in black and white form is the new design featuring a motorcycle rider spotted in the left rear-view mirror of an automobile.

In addition to imploring vehicle drivers to watch for motorcyclists, the

billboard emphasizes one situation a motorcycle rider encounters: riding in the lane to the left rear of the driver.

The billboard was created using a sophisticated computer composite of several photographs. Individual shots were selected of the rider, the rear view mirror, and various foregrounds. They were then combined in a graphics computer and given different color tones to create the striking visual effect. The mysterious rider

is Site Coordinating Instructor Bob Jones and the motorcycle was provided by Honda Peninsula in Sunnyvale.

The billboard's "See See Rider" caption is a play upon the Dick and Jane reading textbooks and the CMSP's now-fabled CC-RIDER 800 information number.

Patrick Media Group is donating space for 60 billboards in Sacramento and the San Francisco Bay Area and 60 in the Los Angeles and San Diego areas.

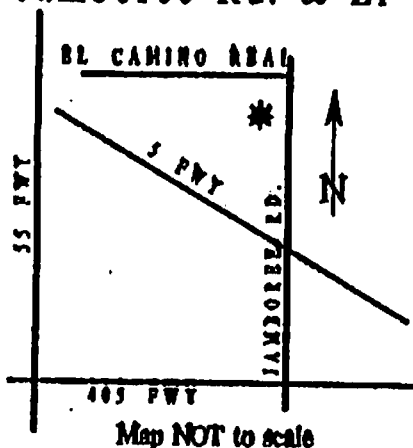
