

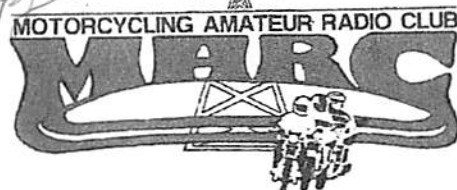

Imagine that many of you will get this email more than once, I sincerely apologize for that, as I am trying to get my Eudora email address book moved over into the MS Outlook 2010 email program. So please be kind and bear with me awhile.

### MARC NEWS;

This is my first attempt at doing a MARC newsletter article using the MS Explorer 2010 program. So bear with me. Not everyone that has been receiving my monthly reports in the past will get this one, as I don't have an address book set up yet in this email program. I have only been using this program a month since Goggle shut my email program down when Goggle would no longer support the Eudora program. Bummer. Next to this MS Explorer program, Eudora was 1000 times easier to navigate through. I had been using Eudora for probably more than 20 years.

There is one MARC/Multiple Sclerosis charity event coming up on Saturday & Sunday Oct. 17<sup>th</sup> & 18<sup>th</sup>. It is always the biggest event of the year and with the most bicycle riders. It starts at the Great Park in Irvine on Saturday morning and ends late Sunday afternoon South of San Diego at Mission Bay. I have not been able to sign up for it yet as I can't get into the MS 150 web site to do the paper work as a volunteer. It asks for a User name and Password and I have tried everyone I have ever used and it won't let me in to the site. So I might not be able to work it for the first time in 24 years. I for sure won't be riding Casper, (our white 2004 Honda Gold Wing) on the charity event, haven't had Casper out of the garage in at least 3 months, although I do start it up about every 2 weeks and let it run until the cooling fans come on, so I know that the thermostat is working. One of these days I will have to get Casper out on the road. Casper is for sale, but haven't had any takers for it yet.

As everyone should know by now, and if not, here is a reminder, that we will not be holding the annual MARC Christmas Party at the Citrus Café as we had in the past. We couldn't get enough MARC members signed up for it to cover the cost of putting on a party there, so we took a vote with the MARC members in attendance at the August MARC meeting and it was decided to just hold a Christmas party at the HomeTown Buffet, where we hold our regular MARC meetings and hold it in the morning at our regular meeting time. HomeTown Buffet manager gave permission to run our meeting an extra hour that day, so it should work out good for us.

### Ray News;

Mostly Medical news, on Friday July 31<sup>st</sup> I finish 8 weeks or therapy for the pinched sciatic nerve that was causing a muscle in my right leg to shrink. That leg has recovered fully now. So about half way through the therapy I went back to riding the bicycle 10 miles a day, doing about an hour worth of exercises at home for the same thing I was going to therapy for. I also have a back machine that that lets me hang upside down at about 70 or 80 degrees and use that 3 or 4 times a week. That

actually works best for me and eliminates the need to be doing all of those other exercises they prescribed for me to do at home. I have cut back riding the bicycle to just 5 miles a day, 5 days a week for now. Then a couple of weeks ago I was having trouble with my right ankle and went to see a specialist about that. Took lots of x-rays of both ankles and did nothing for my ankle. When walking on it for a long time it becomes very sore and hard to walk on it. So the doctor said to not walk on it for long periods of time, .Yeh, right. Then I had a couple of bad spots show up on the outside of the left forearm, so I go in tomorrow (Tuesday Sept 1<sup>st</sup>) to get those froze off. Now also my heart has been acting up when I ride the bicycle to hard and the heart jumps up from about 110 beats to over 150 beats and gets out of rhythm, so I have to stop a while and wait for the heart settle back down and finish the ride. The last couple of day it has not been bothering me, but I think I better get back in to see my Cardiologist just in case. Always something going on.

Last week we had the termite company here and there are couple of places they are coming back to fix this week. Then next week we have the painters coming to paint all the trim on the house. Hasn't been down for 4 or 5 years and where the new construction was done a few years ago it needs it badly. Always something to work on around here.

The last week in Oct. I am signed up for the Front Sight 4 Day Handgun Course again, but I may have to cancel that if my health is acting up just before we go. It will be the 8<sup>th</sup> time I have done that course and I should be getting it right pretty soon. J I really love going out to Front Sight, that is about 20 miles South of Pahrump NV just off Highway 160, the road between Las Vegas and Pahrump. I love the shooting drills and certainly the comarderie amongst the people we go with. It's just so much fun. Four Days of steady shooting and we go through about 700 rounds. We leave Irvine on Sunday morning, shoot Monday thru Thursday and come home after we finish shooting drills on Thursday. We always get the same instructor and we have been there so many times we are all on a first name bases.

**FROM ILLEGAL TO LEGAL**

It is legal in CA but in some other states NO!!  
Advice to motorcyclists are recommended riding between the left lanes (where drivers are "more accustomed" to it) and not lane splitting near trucks, at night on unfamiliar roads, or in bad weather.

It unequivocally authorizes motorcycles to drive between stopped or slow moving vehicles," as long as traffic is moving at 50 MPH or less and the "motorcyclist doesn't outrun traffic by more than 15 MPH."

The big upside of riding between cars is obvious for motorcyclists: while the chumps on four wheels are crawling over the Bay Bridge at 3 MPH, cyclists are zipping through. Good for drivers too, because motorcyclists who lane split reduce congestion and carbon emissions.

After studying one congested stretch of road, researchers found replacing 10 percent of cars with motorcycles would cut time stuck in traffic 63%-for everyone.

Carbon emissions drop 6%, due largely to smoother traffic flow. The study didn't specifically consider lane splitting, but noted that "when traffic comes to a complete standstill, it can be assumed that all motorcycles drive between two lanes."

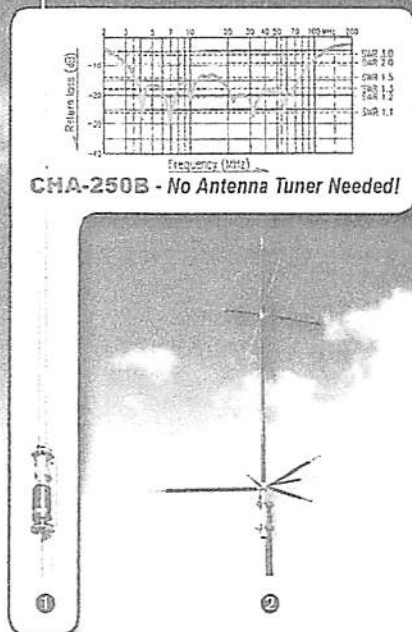
Traffic filtering is actually a viable safety technique, as it removes the motorcycle and rider from the danger spot behind a stopped car, and places the motorcycle into the more secure safety envelope that is created between two larger vehicles and California had significantly fewer motorcyclist fatalities from rear end collisions

They are working on a legal law in California to make Lane splitting very legal.. which will make it easier for the California State Patrol and the Department of Motor Vehicles to educate drivers on this practice.

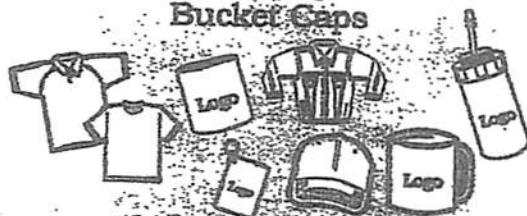

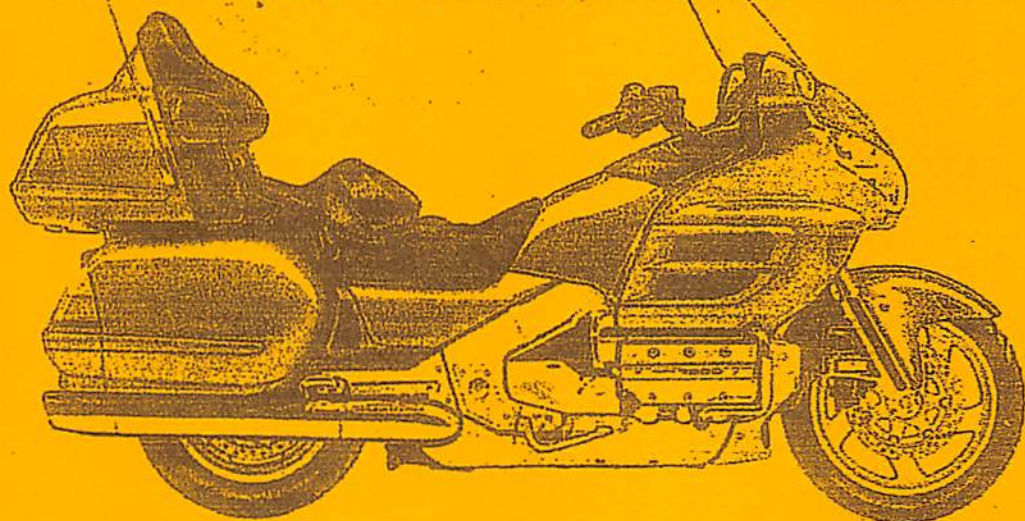
