From your Orange County MS 150 Coordinators: First please make note of the Date of the MS150 ride for this year October 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup>, 2008

The MS150 Bay to Bay Bike Tour is quickly approaching. The last regular meeting of the Planning Committee was held on September 3. The routes are set except for any last minute issues with street construction. So far 2036 riders have signed up which is an increase over last year's participants. \$505,370 has already been collected which is a 10% increase over the money collected last year at this time. For the new 30 mile loop, starting in Carlsbad on Saturday, 109 people are signed up with 95 of those being first time participants. There are 40 Ride Marshals presently signed up to ensure that the riders follow the MS rules as well as traffic regulations.

The new 30 mile route will leave from and return to the 1st day finishing point in Carlsbad, using part of the route from the 2nd day of the 2 day event. The Century and the 2 day ride are much the same as last year starting 18500 Von Karman Ave in Irvine and

ending at the Westfield Shoppingtown, in Carlsbad, on the first night and Hospitality Point on Mission Bay San Diego on the 2nd day. It will be a beautiful ride along the beach both days.

Time is getting short. The Tour will be held October 11 and 12. We will have 3 routes to support this year: 30 miles, Century Challenge, and the 2 day ride. We need as many motorcycles as we can get. If your motorcycle is in for repairs we can still use you. If you can spend just one day or even part of one day helping it would be a great benefit.

The Saga of the 742.

This story started like most radio involved work starts. That is, the human goofed. I decided to move the control head for my 742, which is on my 1500, from the center console, to the handle bar. I contacted Ray, about changing the routing of the harness from the left side to the right side of the bike. Oh, I'd already unhooked the control head (without unplugging the power cord) and started moving things around. Ray, meanwhile told me not to change the position, due to the adverse affects from vibration on the handlebars. I said thank you to Ray, and hooked everything back up, still without unplugging the power cord. Needless to say, the radio quit working. I troubleshot the system, but had a pretty good idea when I unplugged the power to check the voltage, what the problem was. The "itsy bitsy" internal "chip" fuse.

I contacted Kenwood, and got outstanding support from the tech's about the part # and location in the radio. I then called "Pacific Parts" and ordered 5 fuses, so that I'd have some extra's just in case.

I ordered them priority mail, should have taken no more than 2 day's. 7 day's later, still no fuses. I call to check on the status of the order and find out that it's on hold, waiting for the arrival of 4 of the 5 fuses to arrive. Oh, and there is no ETA. I tell them that I've got a radio apart on the bench waiting on the order, so send me the 1 they have now, then send me the other 4 later. OK, they can do that, but they will have to double bill me for the shipping. I finally tell them to cancel the backordered 4, and just send me the 1. 5 day's later, "you guessed it" still no fuse. I call, again.

The order is in the warehouse being processed for shipment. I talk to the supervisor, to find out that, it sat there, because they couldn't decide what was canceled. Again, I explain that I have the radio apart waiting for this, Late, Late part. I get a lot of apologies, and she sent me the fuse by UPS, no charge. I got the fuse the next day and, using magnifiers, soldered the new fuse in. After careful testing to make sure everything was working OK, I almost did it again. You guessed it, I almost unplugged the control head THE wrong way. Everything is back on the bike, and everything is working good. This was the worst time I've ever had on all the parts, I've ordered from Pac Parts. I just hope it doesn't start a trend.

Hope to see you at the meeting in September. I have a surprise for the meeting, so come if you can.

Leaning back on their steeds, sunglasses, feet up on the highway bars, some with a smoke hanging on their lip and that funny little head bandana. Cracks me up. Republican National Committee Director Meets with MRF
On a picture perfect August day, the Motorcycle Riders Foundation
believes that it elevated it's lobbying efforts to a new level. For
several months the MRF had initiated letter, e-mail and phone
correspondence with the Republican National Committee (RNC)
requesting a meeting. The hope was to discuss our concerns with
them over several appointees and members of President Bush's
administration. We felt that going to the hierarchy of the
Republican Party would be a unique course of action to attempt to
influence this (and future) administrations.

After learning of our efforts to meet with them, RNC Chairman Mike Duncan asked their Director of Government Affairs, Will Kinzel, to arrange a meeting with us. The MRF readily accepted Mr. Kinzel's offer to meet on August 11, 2008 at their headquarters in Washington DC.

Representing the MRF was Jeff Hennie; Vice President of Government Relations, Dave Dwyer; Sustaining State Motorcyclists Rights Organization Representative, Tiffany Latimer; Washington Office Manager/Communications Assistant and Michael Kerr; Vice President of the MRF.

The meeting was candid and direct with the MRF citing by name, the appointees and their actions that we had grievances with. Our concerns were attentively listened to, but the comment was made that little could be done in regard to appointees of the current administration. At that point it was agreed that our discussion would focus on the future rather than the past. The exact number of days until the November election was mentioned. Suggestions were made as to how the MRF could leverage our political activism in regard to influencing future presidential appointees.

The MRF inquired as to what the Republican Party's position is on Federalism and the 10th amendment to the constitution. It was answered in a straightforward manner. We were told that the Republican Party remains committed to smaller government and to delegating as much government as possible to the states and local units.

The RNC expressed an interest in the MRF and the motorcyclist rights movement. They had questions of their own. One was whether any of us were in Sturgis when Senator McCain gave his speech. Others were more political in nature.

The meeting ended on a cordial note with the MRF representatives and Mr. Kinzel having their picture taken together in a reception area of their headquarters.

After the meeting with the RNC, the MRF representatives walked to the headquarters of the Democratic National Committee (DNC). We have made repeated attempts to contact them requesting a meeting. To date, we have not received a reply. So we decided to personally deliver our candidate survey and ask to speak with someone (anyone would do) from the DNC. We were told by a security guard that no one was available, but we could leave our material for them.

We will be shifting gears - so to speak - in regard to making contact with the Democratic Party and their presidential candidate.

After the convention we will begin to work on getting a meeting with the campaign staff of Senator Obama at his election headquarters in Chicago. We are anxious to meet with them. The MRF believes August 11, 2008 to be an historic day in the history of the motorcyclists' rights movement. From our rather humble beginnings we have risen to where the leadership of the national political parties is taking us seriously and is willing to work with us on our issues.




