From the President's Desk

I hope you had a Very Merry Christmas and a Delightful New Year. Mijo and I enjoyed our holidays with family and friends. The Christmas dinner with our MARC family was one of the highlights of the season.

Now that the decorations have all been put away for the season, it is time to return to business. Harold, KI6TYH, Mijo, KF6BEB, and I have been busy getting ready for the Tour of Palm Springs 2010. Yes, it is time to ride again. The Palm Springs Tour committee was very impressed with MARC and the help we were able to provide for their event last year. We have been invited back for the 2010 Tour. Harold and I ask you to, please, make plans to help us with the Tour of Palm Springs on Saturday 13 February 2010. The first wave of 100 mile bicycle riders will start at 7:00 AM and Net Control will have to be set up and operational long before that. Many of us will be riding out to Palm Springs on Friday 12 February 1010 and overnighting. This also means that the February MARC meeting will be bumped up one week to the 6th of February. I will remind you of this change on the MARC List and also on the weekly MARC Net. Bruce Yeager, of the Palm Springs Tour committee, has already given me a copy of the 100, 55, and 25 mile routes. I have passed them on to Chuck, KG6NJP, so the GPS routes can be done before he has his shoulder surgery in January. We hope both Chuck and Ray, KD6FHN, will be mended and ready for the Tour in February. I already have a list of MARC members who have volunteered for this event. Harold and I will have more information and a sign-up sheet at the January and February MARC meetings.

Bearing failure in the steering head of my Goldwing or do you have pull backs (set backs) on your Goldwing? I have a 2001, 1800 Goldwing that has "pull backs" on the handlebars, they were installed by Ray and Chuck when Chuck owned the, "Yellow Monster". Last summer I had the front shocks serviced at a local repair shop. They changed the fluid in both front shock absorbers as part of the service. In the process, they inadvertently rerouted the clutch line. This is the high pressure hydraulic line that carries fluid from the clutch lever/slave to the clutch master cylinder. For the past two or three months, I thought that the bearings in my steering were worn and would need replacement. Last week during a routine oil change I raised the front of "Sissie," my yellow monster, with a floor jack and tested the front of the cycle for any looseness or wobble. As I turned the front from side to side, I could feel a pronounced snag in the steering. There was no looseness or wobble. With further investigation, I found that the clutch "cable" (hydraulic line) had been pulled loose from the clip on the top of the left shock absorber and was chafing on the edge of the faring. This is what had been causing my erratic steering. I rerouted the line and tied it securely with tie wraps and also made sure that it was held tightly in the proper clamp on top of the left shock. It is worn but does not leak; I will keep an eye on it and make sure that it stays away from any surface that could further chafe the line. My steering is now as smooth as ever and I hope it stays that way.

Also, please note that you now have the option of receiving your monthly newsletter online in lieu of snail mail. The newsletter will be posted on the MARC Web page within a day or two of

We can even put a reminder on the MARC List each time the newsletter is updated on the Web Page, thus making it easier to read or print your

If so, remember that you must be present at the January MARC meeting to collect. Good luck! 

Ten Things All Car & Truck Drivers Should Know About Motorcycles

Over half of all fatal motorcycle crashes involve another vehicle. Most of the time, the motorist, not the motorcyclist, is at fault. There are a lot more cars and trucks than motorcycles on the road, and some drivers don't "recognize" a motorcycle - they ignore it (usually unintentionally).

Because of its small size, a motorcycle can be easily hidden in a car's blind spots (door/roof pillars) or masked by objects or backgrounds outside a car (bushes, fences, bridges, etc). Take an extra moment to look for motorcycles, whether you're changing lanes or turning at intersections.

Because of its small size, a motorcycle may look farther away than it is. It may also be difficult to judge a motorcycle's speed. When checking traffic to turn at an intersection or into (or out of) a driveway, predict a motorcycle is closer than it looks.

Motorcyclists often slow by downshifting or merely rolling off the throttle, thus not activating the brake light. Allow more following distance, say 3 or 4 seconds. At intersections, predict a motorcyclist may slow down without visual warning.

Motorcyclists often adjust position within a lane to be seen more easily and to minimize the effects of road debris, passing vehicles, and wind. Understand that motorcyclists adjust lane position for a purpose, not to be reckless or show off or to allow you to share the lane with them.

Turn signals on a motorcycle usually are not self-canceling, thus some riders (especially beginners) sometimes forget to turn them off after a turn or lane change. Make sure a motorcycle's signal is for real.

Maneuverability is one of a motorcycle's better characteristics, especially at slower speeds and with good road conditions, but don't expect a motorcyclist to always be able to dodge out of the

Stopping distance for motorcycles is nearly the same as for cars. but slippery pavement makes stopping quickly difficult. Allow more following distance behind a motorcycle because it can't always stop "on a dime."

When a motorcycle is in motion, see more than the motorcycle see the person under the helmet, who could be your friend, neighbor, or relative.

If a driver crashes into a motorcyclist, bicyclist, or pedestrian and causes serious injury, the driver would likely never forgive himself/herself.

The wind was blowing pretty hard at times too, so some of those that had planned on coming and had bought raffle prize tickets, didn't make it because of the severe weather. Certainly can't blame them for not coming. The turn out was still very good and we certainly had some expensive prizes to draw for. I am sure that Mijo or Bonnie has an article in the newsletter somewhere in here to tell you who won what. I again got lucky and won the set of tires from Huntington Honda and also won 3 or 4 other smaller prizes. I tried to make a deal with someone for the tires but got no takers. I already have another set of tires coming that I won at either last years Christmas Party or the MARC Anniversary last May. No I can't ride Casper right now, so I am not able to put any wear on the tires that are on Casper now. So if anyone needs a set of tires at say 50% of the cost of having a set bought and installed at Huntington Honda, give me a call (949-300-9669) or send me an email. We had so many wonderful raffle prizes this year that I don't think anyone went home empty handed.
- 3. Speaking of Huntington Honda, we have been having some pretty good turn outs for our Saturday morning informal gettogethers for pastries and free coffee. We normally kick tires and tell lies there until about 10:30am and then over to Woody's 50's Dinner for more kicking tires and telling more lies. Hi, Hi.
- 4. This is no lie, I am now into the 9th week since the right shoulder replacement and am doing much better then both the surgeon and the therapist thought possible. I have been in therapy only 7 weeks and there is another fellow there that had his shoulder done 6 weeks ahead of me and I am darn near caught up to him with the many motions that the shoulder has to do. Still have a long way to go, but am hoping that if I continue to work hard at rehab I will be able to ride Casper for the Tour de Palm Springs Saturday Feb 13th. That would be way ahead of the time table that the surgeon had said it would take before I could ride again. For those that have been through a shoulder replacement surgery and for those that may someday have to have it done, it is by far the hardest joint to rehab in the body. I had both hips done, one 11 years ago and the other 12 years ago there is no comparison getting the hips rehabbed to getting a shoulder replacement back in shape. Wish I had followed the surgeons suggestion 10 years ago and had both of them done then. I am still out walking 1 1/2 miles a day and working out at home lifting weights (7 Lb. Heavy Hands dumbbells) and using the Therabands (heavy rubber bands hooked to a door knob) working on the shoulders about 2 hours a day.
- 5. I went in today to get a CTA scan of my right carotid artery because the ultrasound that I had done before Christmas showed

that I had more plaque build up then the last time we looked at it two years ago. Won't hear until next week what today's testing will show, but this will be the 3rd time that I have gone through this and the other 2 times I actually went into the hospital operating room and they cut open the artery in my right groin area and was going to put a stent in, but decided after looking at it from the inside, not to put a stent in as the artery was not over 65% blocked. This time they think it is over 70% blocked. We'll have to wait and see what happens this time.

- 6. Talking about the Tour de Palm Springs, we have a new assistant coordinator to help John W5JFR now and he is Harold KI6TYH. Thank you very much Harold and we really appreciate you getting more involved with MARC and stepping up to the plate to help John with the Tour de Palm Springs. We love to see our MARC members get more involved in our charity events, after all, that is what MARC is all about.
- 7. Last but not least, New Years resolutions. Not much to talk about here. I only have about 7 Lbs. to lose again after New Years day and that will be easy once I stop eating all of the Christmas candy and drinking the eggnog. For the most part I have been really careful about my diet since losing that 30 Lbs. this year and I promise myself that I will never get to where I can't wear my 34 size waist pants again. That 7 Lbs. will be gone again in short order after New Years.
- 8. Skype, well I hadn't heard about that program until my daughter told me that she talked to my grandson in Japan for 1.5 hours for free and could see him like he was sitting across the table from her. So after that we went out and bought a Logitec Web Cam and down loaded the free program and picked out a good name to use on Skype (if you are thinking about getting on Skype too, be sure to carefully choose your Skype name). I did not like the first name I chose and had to uninstall Skype to choose another name I liked and everyone would recognize who I was (ray.daviskd6fhn). There many, many Ray Davis' so I went through many ray.davis' plus something else before I finally decided to use my ham call sign and that way no other Ray Davis could have that. I have 14 people on my contact list already and 8 of them are MARC members. Like Mikey says, "Try it, you'll like it".

Work hard on the MARC charity events and enjoy life the best we can and maintain our health. What more could we ask for?

washington, D.C. — President Obama, on Friday, announced that he has nominated David L. Strickland to be the new administrator of the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). Strickland has served for eight years on the staff of the U.S. Senate Committee on Commerce, Science.

the U.S. Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation. As the Senior Counsel for the Consumer Protection Subcommittee, he is currently the lead staff person for the oversight of the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), the Federal Trade Commission, and the Consumer Product Safety Commission. He has also served as the lead Senate staff person in the formulation of the Corporate Average Fuel Economy (CAFE) reforms and standards included in the Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007, and in a staff leadership role in the reauthorization of the NHTSA in the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act of 2005 (SAFETEA-LU).

His work in advising Commerce Committee members led to the inclusion of several significant vehicle safety mandates, including the electronic stability control mandate for every passenger vehicle. Mr. Strickland advised Congressional members on safety reforms and funding increases for the NHTSA's seatbelt and drunk driving grant programs. Mr. Strickland earned his J.D. degree at Harvard Law School, and his B.S. Degree in Communication Studies and Political Science at Northwestern University.

Strickland's nomination was the subject of a Senate Hearing yesterday where he faced no opposition. The MRF looks forward to continue to work with Mr. Strickland once he is approved by the full Senate. We hope he takes a sensible approach to motorcycle safety.

2010 grant money

The last round of the 2010 grant money was dispersed recently. \$7 Million dollars total was sent to individual states to be used for motorcycle safety purposes. All 50 states received at least \$100,000 with some of the more populated states getting more than \$300,000.




