FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK:

I hope that all who read this newsletter had a very merry Christmas and a happy New Year. Mijo and I had a very good Christmas with family and friends and enjoyed a pleasant, quiet New Year with each other at home.

It's the time of year that is reveled in by those who love football and hated by those who rue the day that the first touchdown was ever scored. I don't know which of these you fall into but I hope that you enjoy the days between now and super bowl Sunday.

The December rains of southern California only dampened our spirits a bit. We did receive over 22 inches of rain (unofficial by my rain gauge) here in Rialto. With all the damage from flooding in the nearby communities, we dodged the bullet. More rain has been forecast for the next few days; I hope not too much. I am an Emergency Communicator for the Rialto Fire Department and our club was put into action by the City when the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) was activated due to the threat of flooding. We, the emergency communications team, worked from noon till six PM manning radios in the command post and on various fire engines and EMT trucks, providing communications when the emergency services radios were needed for official/disaster use. At six, we were sent home and placed on a 24 hour telephone standby. Thankfully we were not needed and were allowed to stand down. All went well and it would seem that our practice and training sessions were time well spent. I personally rode in an EMT unit and was on stand-by for

two hours at the local fuel farm a gasoline leak in one of the tanks and the resulting fume cloud had to be monitored. Chief Bekker also provided our group with a Fire Dept. pickup with instructions to patrol the areas of the city subject to the greatest flooding hazard as well as the flood control basins and to areas to report any unusual conditions back to the EOC via our amateur radio link.

The Tour de Palm Springs is a go! I hope you can plan on helping with this event on Saturday, 12 February 2011. Many of us who are working the tour will be going to Palm Springs on Friday afternoon so we will be there bright and early on Saturday morning to set up net control and prepare for a day of chasing bicycles. If you are going to ride out there on Friday, I would encourage you to make motel reservations early as the rooms in the area seem to fill rapidly as the date of the ride approaches. As this event is on the second Saturday of the month, it means that we will have to adjust our meeting for February. Watch for the new date! Harold, KI6TYH, and I will have more information for all at the January MARC meeting so please plan on being there.

Have you been listening to the MARC net on Wednesday? There has been a change made to our "It pays to listen." Starting with the November 2010 nets, we are going to give a free breakfast to the lucky individual who listens for two weeks and answers when his/her call is drawn from our number can. **QUICK TIPS: General Guidelines For Riding A
Motorcycle Safely**

Be visible:

- Remember that motorists often have trouble seeing motorcycles and reacting in time.
- Make sure your headlight works and is on day and night.
- Use reflective strips or decals on your clothing and on your motorcycle.
- Be aware of the blind spots cars and trucks have.
- Flash your brake light when you are slowing down and before stopping.
- If a motorist doesn't see you, don't be afraid to use your horn.

Dress for safety:

- Wear a quality helmet and eye protection.
- Wear bright clothing and a light-colored helmet.
- Wear leather or other thick, protective clothing.
- Choose long sleeves and pants, over-the-ankle boots, and gloves.
- Remember -- the only thing between you and the road is your protective gear.

Apply effective mental strategies:

- Constantly search the road for changing conditions. Use MSF's Search, Evaluate, Execute strategy (SEESM) to increase time and space safety margins.
- Give yourself space and time to respond to other motorists' actions.
- Give other motorists time and space to respond to you.
- Use lane positioning to be seen; ride in the part of a lane where you are most visible.
- Watch for turning vehicles.
- Signal your next move in advance.
- Avoid weaving between lanes.
- Pretend you're invisible, and ride extra defensively.
- Don't ride when you are tired or under the influence of alcohol or other drugs.
- Know and follow the rules of the road, and stick to the speed limit.

Know your bike and how to use it:

- Get formal training and take refresher courses.
- Call 800.446.9227 or visit www.msf-usa.org to locate the Motorcycle Safety Foundation hands-on RiderCourseSM nearest you.
- Practice. Develop your riding techniques before going into heavy traffic. Know how to handle your bike in conditions such as wet or sandy roads, high winds, and uneven surfaces.

Remember: Give yourself space. People driving cars often just don't see motorcycles. Even when drivers do see you, chances are they've never been on a motorcycle and can't properly judge your speed.

A Love Ride update:

After last year's cancellation of the Love Ride, we were told that it would be at least a couple of years before the event would return. Understandably, the owner of Glendale Harley, Oliver was tired, and with the looming prospects of losing money on the event, we figured that 2 years was probably the minimum. Well, it turned out that there was a lot of pressure put on the Love Ride Organization to host an event this year, and Nov 7 was the date. It was called Love Ride 26 Retro, and was a throw back to the very early days of the event. Not a lot of organization, simple stage and parking areas, and a return to the Calimigos Ranch in the Santa Monica mountains above Malibu. The plan was to pre-sell tickets before the event, and for riders to stop by Glendale and pickup the ticket passes and ride directly to the Ranch. Celebrities were present, Jay Leno et al, Lorenzo Lamas, and Willy Davidson, but there was no stage, no concert, and no fences. John, WSJFR, Bill, K6WBD, and Mark, KE6ZRP were asked by the Love Ride committee to help escort the celebrities leaving Glendale on their way to the Ranch. John could not attend, but Bill and I did as asked, and found that we just followed the group. Not much more than that. No real work involved. Easy gig as they say. For this, we got a 50% discount on the event. Half price for the same meal as everyone else, same music, and same nice Ranch. We hope that we will be asked to do it again next year.

Since then, I have received a couple of e-mails from the committee and from the person in charge of this past event. I am sure that changes will be made for next year's event. Some of the ideas that they had worked, the early registration, and the destination. The Ranch is similar to Oak Park for the Bad Ride in size, without the

lake, but a few more buildings and more of a wooded feel to it. What they had problems with was that most of the people did not take their tickets and head straight to the Ranch, they hung around Glendale, thinking it was going to be like in the past. Quite quickly, the surrounding streets got filled up and overflowing. San Fernando Rd was not shut down, so it was only the side streets that they used. I sort of feel that they may return to San Fernando Rd next year because of the number of bikes. And there is a big push by the City of Glendale to have the bikes run up Brand Blvd. It seems they like to hear the roar of bikes, and to attract people to the center of Glendale. (Well, some bikes roar).

I would also like to let everyone know that they limited participation to less than 2000 riders this year. That figure will probably go up next year some, but this practice makes sense, much like the MS does with their event. They raised \$ 250.000 this year on a simple ride. Not bad. They paid some outstanding old bills for the canceled ride, and they gave a good amount of money to the charity "Autism Speaks" If you follow the history of the Love Ride, it has mostly been a fund raising event for local charities that benefit children. That seems to be the goal of the Love Ride, and it looks like it will continue next year as well. I hope so.

National Transportation Safety Board Calls for
Nationwide Helmet Laws

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation reports that the
National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) is
calling on all States that do not have a mandatory
helmet law to adopt one. The NTSB has a "top ten
most wanted" list that has never before addressed
motorcycle helmet law, but does now. They are
asking for every State to enact mandatory helmet
law for every rider and passenger on every
motorcycle.

This is a disturbing, but not surprising,
recommendation by the NTSB. They had a forum in
2007 where they brought in some motorcycle safety
professionals and asked them a few questions, they
then relied on their motorcycle crash investigations,
a whopping six in total crash investigations to issue
some safety recommendations. This pales in
comparison to the over 150,000 airline incident
investigations, over 90,000 other surface
transportation investigations, which does more than
qualify them to issue such recommendations. But
investigating just six motorcycle accidents and now
they are the experts?

What's also surprising is the fact that motorcycle
deaths declined last year. For the first time in 11
years motorcycle fatalities went down, and not just
a few percentage points. Motorcycle fatalities were
down 16 percent last year. And it is not because
people were riding less, vehicle miles traveled for
motorcycles was down just a half a percent over the
previous year, according to the US DOT.

The NTSB has no regulatory ability and no law
making ability, just the power to issue
recommendations to the States, industry and the
Federal government. We at the MRF are troubled by
the NTSB issuing recommendations about anything
motorcycle, with such a lack of expertise in the arena
of motorcycling and a seemingly nonchalant attitude
towards the motorcyclists of this country.

The following brackets are the ones we keep here at the house for our MARC members. These are not sold by MARC..

PTT Button Bracket

Fits under the left handlebar module and positions the button so it is right where your left thumb is naturally under the left hand grip. Fits 1500 and 1800 Gold Wings and some other Honda models. Has been adapted to some other brands and models. Black anodized or plain aluminum available. Has standard 1/2" hole for PTT button. Price \$10.00

PTT Waterproof Button

Has large rounded surface for your thumb, so your thumb does not get tired or sore with heavy use. Black in color. Fits in 1/2" hole on PTT Button Bracket. Price \$13.00

Antenna Bracket For 1/2" Tubular Trunk Racks

Natural aluminum color only Fits coax with SO-239 fitting only for antennas with PL-259 fittings, can not be modified to use with NMO fittings. Price \$25.00

You're bound to have a happy new year.

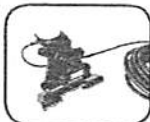
