### Lighthouses, National Parks and Me

# Blue and myself see Lighthouses, National Parks, Natural Beauty, Thousands of miles and Memories Stored to Camera and Mind.

I started planning this trip in about January, I had two things in mind, number 1 first and foremost was the need to get up and see the grandbabies. Now I fly up there usually about every 3 months and just figured to take my vacation time and do it up right. My first truly big trip on the new to me GoldWing. So I had 4 months to make this to stay in better weather up north. I had been talking to my brother another diehard Red Sox fan like myself and we were looking to get in a new Stadium. Since I was riding it had to be out west and after checking the schedule I determined for me it had to be Seattle. So I had to plan this into the work and wife schedule, Maggie was heading to the British Isles, so this trip would be solo, and with my weird schedule I set aside Aug 5-22<sup>nd</sup>, the Sox get to Seattle the 12<sup>th</sup>. So I had some time to kill in route so I began thinking of how to plan it so I can see a game without going to Spokane then backtracking and then going back again to Spokane.

After a few different thoughts I decided this was my chance to see almost every Lighthouse on the West Coast of the continental USA. Now the real work, planning this turned into much more than I anticipated. First, most lighthouses are not listed with a street address. They are generally so isolated they become the building on the end of numerous Lighthouse Ave, Dr, Blvd, etc. Or they are located on an island! Try programming that into your GPS. This was also my first attempt to program the Garmin Zumo, I spent several days with crappy results until I learned that you could input data as a coordinate so I got Desktop doing Google maps to all the sites, then I pulled that same location up on my laptop with the Garmin software and I looked at Google then I clicked on that spot on the Garmin software and got the coordinates, then I took the Zumo in hand and forced the information into it with a couple of nights with no sleep until I finally had all these in. Then add similar info for every other spot of interest I learned about and break it into approximately 1 days ride, times 17 days. Added to this is the stuff I also had to procure since Id be camping mostly, and there was probably 1 month of free time devoted to pre-departure prep. And dont forget the packing!

### Finally time to leave.

Now I happen to live in Victorville, CA, so the easy thing to do would be to take the freeway system to my first light at Fermin Point, but my Zumo does have a nice feature if you let it picks out motorcycle friendly trips and it showed me this in early planning by sending me to Wrightwood and across Highway 2, to La Canada, spelled La Canada, NOT!!! La canyarda. Sorry the Maine in me came out there. But I did this trip and I had only one regret, 20 other gender bicyclists that are apparently deaf! I had the tunes cranked so I wouldnt GW sneak-up-on-them. But they refused to share the road like they bicyclist slogan is so apt to point out after finally slipping by (insert horn honk here) and a nice twisty road to prepare me for the PCH Redondo to Santa Monica (30 miles nearly 2 hrs).

### Day 1 Highlights!

One of the more unusual Lighthouses on the pacific coast is Point Fermin. Its located at the mouth of the Long Beach Harbor. Its a nice day ride the group should attempt sometime soon. Its very ornate and just up the coast is Point Vicente both stand on Bluffs between Longbeach and Redondo. Thanks to the traffic on the PCH I crossed the Ventura County Line at lunchtime, a favorite spot Neptunes Net very conveniently became a stop. It was quite crowded and I was just sitting to eat when a real live imported Irish Triumph rider was looking for a place to sit. I learned he was over here on a rented (OMG) Harley and touring all over the So Cal area. We parted new friends as He headed to Mulholland Rd then the return of the rental and I headed north again.

Port Huemeume has a seldom seen Lighthouse I tried using my retiree access to locate and get pictures but signs in the area said photography is prohibited except on special tours only available on certain Saturdays of the month. Back on the road and up to Santa Barbara, where Lighthouse #4 was disappointment #2. This more modern Light sits on a small

tower but its located in a gated community and I got 2 poor quality pics thru a chain link fence. So on to Vandenberg AFB, my tent on the base Famcamp (US Air Force slang for family campground), the facility is really quite nice. I got a nights sleep and attempted to locate the former site of Point Conception Lighthouse but loose sand road and GWs dont mix well so I gave up trying to find a modern version of the beautiful past, a short antenna tower with a fixed light Not very photographic anyways.

### Day 2.

Out the gate and on to Port Luis Obispo. Along the way I saw a flock of 35-50 turkeys, the first Id ever seen in CA. Ok I soon learned that Disappointments were to be dealt with after driving to the last Pier on the port road I found out the Road leading to the light was owned by a Power Authority, and it would be 3 hours before the tours started. (Ill take Maggie someday and well plan the tour as part of the day.) This one just needs a devoted planned trip. Maybe some of you would like to join us! Did I mention this would be a Route 1 not a Route 101 trip so up the road to Morrow Bay, then San Simeon, I considered going to the Entrance only to find out they bus you up and the tour was like 2 hrs long. Have you been to the Elephant Seal viewing area just up from San Simeon. This turned out to be quite fascinating as the bulls were doing mock battles in the surf.

At 10am I pulled into the Piedras Blancas Lighthouse Road, They had A tour with several characters acting and telling us of their life I shortened the tour but had a real nice visit. I also found out that funds have been allotted for the cupola replacement, which should start next summer. The tour only happens on 1 Saturday a month and only at 10 so I was very grateful for the fortunes putting me there at the right time. 50 miles of PCH coastline brought me to Point Sur Lighthouse. I just missed a tour here but I got some nice pics from the road the lighthouse was 0.07 miles from the road but the 300 mm lens did I pretty nice job of bringing in the lighthouse.

Monterey has Point Pinos Lighthouse it was open and I got some nice pictures. From here I was headed to Santa Cruz, the Breakwater Lighthouse is a pain to get to, its in a residential neighborhood and I got a couple shots of it from between a couple houses. Santa Barbara Lighthouse houses a surfing museum, it was closed for the night. Ano Nuevo Lighthouse is located about 1.3 miles off the coast on an island. It has been at the ravages of the sea for a long time. I got some pics with the 300 mm. zoomed in you can see the windows are simply holes in the outside structure no woodwork appears to be left. But it is now on my list of seen lighthouses. Just a few miles up the coast from it is Pigeon Point Lighthouse. The old keepers cabins have not been restored but were modernized, hopefully the outside will get redone as period in the future. But the lighthouse is in good shape and with some attention could be a real showcase. The keepers cabins are now a hostel. I had reservations and stayed the night here.

### Day 3.

Next north was Point Montara. Its also a hostel the light is a basic spark plug light but the other buildings are gorgeous. Heavy fog that morning so that had its effects on the pics all the next few lights. San Francisco Bay Area Lights. I limited myself to lights on or near the mouth of the bay. Mile light is a spark plug light that the cupola was removed and a modern lamp is sitting on it, its 1 mile off shore on the southern bay mouth. Across from it is Point Bonita, it is a pretty nice light but I barely got more than a shadow of it in the SD card. Point Fort is actually sitting within the fort at the base of the Golden Gate Bridges south end. The interesting thing here is as Im pulling up for the pic, two guys are walking away with 20-inch stripers, WHO KNEW!!! Hmmm now I have to go to the bay area to go fishing lol.

Also among the fog and barely visible was Alcatraz light. Last of the bay area Lights is the deteriorating Lime Point Lighthouse, like Fort point it is virtually under the golden gate bridge but on the north east side. Leaving the golden gate behind I headed up the 101 to the turn off for the PCH US1; the PCH heads for the coast this is absolutely the twistiest section of highway I have traveled in many years for the first 20 miles. GRINSSSS!!! Once you get off that section you follow the bay around to and then you come to Sir Francis Drake Blvd, 22 miles down it is Point Reyes Lighthouse. You park the bike (ok for some of you the car) and walk up and down a fairly steep hill. Finally you reach a set of stairs. Nowhere does it mention this trip is not for the meek (read me). The stairs are 330 strong and numbered so you can measure your misery on the way back up. (BTW, 330 steps equals a 30 story bldg or so the sign said, felt like 50) and I stopped at 280 got my pics and started trudging back up.

Arriving at the Point Arena Lighthouse I could see something special was going on. As I pulled up to the parking area a security guy came up and asked me about parking the bike in the hard packed field that everyone was parking on. I told him I was afraid of the kickstand digging in so he sent me forward almost to the light to park in a gravel parking lot specified for handicapped and RVs. Once off the bike I found out that today was National Lighthouse Day and the Lighthouse was manned with volunteers. This is a superbly kept facility most of the outbuildings are still well maintained. I got to climb the 180 steps to the top outside walkway then climb a ladder into the room containing the light. I was very impressed.

Just when I thought Id finally get to relax I pulled into the parking area for Point Cabrillo Lighthouse. This lighthouse wasnt a hostel but the keepers cabins are available for vacation rentals. I would highly recommend these units for anyone with interest in being in this fairly remote area. After here I headed out of the parking lot I made a stop at the Drive Thru Tree in Leggett, Ca. the roof of the tree opening is 6 ft. 6 inches high. I had antennas dragging all the way through then I stopped at the far side and got a pic of Blue in front of it.

### Monday, Day 4.

Humboldt CA. has had 2 lighthouses the first I came to was on a small island in the bay. It like the Santa Cruz Breakwater Light was put up for local navigation to the marina. Its a nice 2-story structure in the parking lot of the Marina. The Original Humboldt Light was on a spit of land near the mouth of the Humboldt Harbor. This lighthouse succumbed to the ravages of weather many years ago. All that is left is a few memorial plagues and some foundation stones.

Im glad I took the time to seek out this site. I learned of a submarine in WWI that ran aground on the sandbar very near the lighthouse. A navy cruiser was dispatched to pull the submarine back to sea. Unfortunately it was pushed ashore by the heavy currents and was too much to save. The ship was left to local salvage and the weather and sea. Parts can still be seen in the beach during really low tides. The Submarine however was dragged across the mile wide sandy spit and put back in the water to serve out the war. Trinidad Memorial Light this light was another harbor light built by the community to help its seafarers. It is located on the bluff just above the Marina. Trinidad Head Lighthouse is less than 3 miles away but its all on private land and Ill have to get some pictures via boat on another trip if I want to see all that California has to offer in lighthouses.

Next on my list of things to see along the way, were the Redwoods National Park and the Newton B Drury Scenic Drive. Just as I entered the park I saw several Elk bedded down in the first meadow I did see a few calves head bouncing in the grass near the adults. The trees here are the biggest of the Redwoods I saw. The drive was lush green redwoods with moss all over them. At the End of the Redwoods N.P. is Crescent City. It has 2 lighthouses. The first Battery Point Lighthouse. This is located on an island during high tide but I lucked out and found a low tide that allowed me to walk out and get some picture and learn that it is actually a residence but the owner treats t as a park and allows visitors to the outside area. Just north of town the second light is perched on a small rock outcropping about 1.5 miles offshore. St George Reef Lighthouse was the most expensive to be built by the Lighthouse Service at a cost of \$50,000 in the late 1800s due to its isolation and severe weather and currents.

Under the boat, still strapped securely in place was the trailer!

### DRAIN SLIDE

Recently I bought a bike lift to do the regular maintenance on my Harley. As I slid the lift under the Harley I could see that the fluids would be getting all over the lift when I pulled the drain plugs. So, I built this simple drain slide.

In the photos you can see that I took a piece of sheet metal I had laying around and cut it to size. Then I folded the sides up 1/2" with a hand "break". I folded the bottom under against itself 1/2" and the top I folded down 1" with the other side of the "break" so it could hook onto the release handle of the lift.

Now the fluids drain down the slide into the oil pan positioned on the lift base, below. Now it is an easy clean up by just wiping the slide clean with a rag or paper towel.

I have attached photos of the slide installed for use.





### **Congress Exempts Youth Motorcycles, ATVs** and Snowmobiles from Lead Ban

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) has learned that earlier this week, both the US House and US Senate passed a measure to clean up the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC). HR 2715, sponsored by Mary Bono-Mack (R-CA), takes aim at reforming the issue of banning youth products due to lead content percentages. Also known as the Consumer Product Safety Commission Improvement Act (CPSCIA), this bill addresses a number of issues; but first and foremost is the language to fix the lead law.

HR 2715 specifically addresses the issue of youth motorcycles, other off road vehicles, and snowmobiles, effectively exempting them from the lead certification rules. The measure sailed through both the Senate and House by unanimous consent in both chambers. The MRF applauds Congress for addressing this import issue.

The legislation will need the President's signature before becoming law. The MRF encourages you to contact the President and ask him to sign HR 2715 into law.
