FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK:

That will be 46 years since Mijo first came to the United States from France. It doesn't really seem like it has been that long.

We have several events in the near future. I encourage all of our members to wear proper riding attire when working a MARC sanctioned event. We must always present an image of safety and professionalism. A proper helmet is mandatory and, please, wear long pants (no shorts) and appropriate footwear (preferably boots). I would also encourage gloves and long sleeves instead of a short sleeve T-shirt (the sun can be brutal).

I hope the price of gasoline will not discourage our MARC members from participating in the upcoming events. The higher fuel costs will definitely be a prime factor in the number of Support and Gear vehicles that we are able to muster for these events. I am sure it will be a factor in the amount that the charities collect as there will be less discretionary funds in the pockets of the participants.

I didn't do a lot of motorcycle riding during the past month. It was very cool and windy the first part of February here in Rialto. I did manage to sneak in a couple of Patriot Guard missions so the motor was not idle all month. Mijo and I have been very busy with doctor appointments for the past few weeks. We changed insurance the first of the year and have had to establish relationships with all new doctors and specialists. It seems that the appointments will never end. Better to check everything now than to find that there is something out of order the day you really need it for a special ride or event. Enjoy the road and miles of smiles in 2012.

It pretty much are the same members all the time, but every now and then we are surprised by someone other than a regular. We learned in a hurry that the Radio Shack HTX 202's weren't the best answer to what we would need to be doing charity events and using mountain top repeaters for those events. 


