FROM THE CHAIRMAN'S DESK


The days are real short this time of year and at 9.5 hours of daylight as of Dec 28th. Which makes it hard to get everything done while the sun is shining. Yeh, I know, what am I talking about, I am supposed to be retired and have lots of time to spend doing nothing. Well around here it doesn't happen that way. Always things piling up to get done, I thought working for a living was hard/fun.

At 6:30pm on Saturday Dec. 8th we had our MARC Christmas Party at the Citrus Cafe in Tustin, CA. This was the 11th anniversary Christmas Party. MARC had been in existence for 10 years before we decided to have a Christmas Party for our MARC members. It has been a big success from the beginning and this year was no different. Bonnie had been working for weeks getting things in order and making the deal with the Citrus Cafe management. The turn out was great for the party and thanks to Bonnie, Mijo, John R. & John E. and others who contributed so much of their time and work to make this years MARC Christmas Party such a great success. We had many prizes worth hundreds of dollars and everyone went home with at least one prize. Thanks to all that came to the MARC Christmas Party this year and helped make it such a great success again.

On Tuesday Dec. 11th we got our out door Christmas lights up. We did it the easy way this year. One of the neighbor kids across street is 29 years old and unemployed so we hired him to put the lights up for us this year. Every year he has done a spectacular job on their house and it is the biggest attraction in the neighborhood during the Christmas & New Year Holidays. So we gave him a lot of lea way and he purchased some new lights and lighted rope that rims the roof. For the first time ever we have the rear patio decorated too so the cars going by the rear of the house on Remington can see the lights. I also have a heart monitor on the bicycle and I try to keep my heart rate between 110 and 130 for the duration of the ride.

Bonnie and I didn't go anyplace for either Thanksgiving or Christmas. For the Thanksgiving dinner we preordered our big meal from Marie Calendars, which in my humble opinion was not all that good. There was plenty of food with the order and



all the trimmings, but it wasn't the best food I ever tasted for a Thanksgiving meal. So for Christmas Bonnie fixed Cornish Game Hens and put them in the Crock Pot. Now that was really a great treat for Christmas dinner and with all the trimmings it was a spectacular meal. So I haven't weighed myself for about a week, so on Jan 2nd I will weigh myself again and then get right back on my weigh & measure everything I eat, diet. No kidding. It's tough to stay in shape, but it really pays off in the long run. Bonnie still gets up at 5am every morning and goes to Curves 5 days a week.

Here in Southern CA we have been getting rain, not a lot of it, but every couple of days we get a half inch or a little less. So we haven't had to turn on the timer for the sprinklers for about a month. Water bill going down, electrical bill going up. :-) It is working out OK though, as it rains during the night or early morning and by 9am it stops raining although the streets are sometimes still wet.

Breaking News!

Inaccurate Study on Motorcycle Safety Praised by Governors Highway Safety Association.

Recently the Governors Highway Safety Association (GHSA) praised the inaccurate study on motorcycle safety done by the Government Accountability Office (GAO).

What both reports failed to tell you is that motorcyclists are safer now than since 1984. Here's why; in 2010 fatalities were almost identical to 1984, around 4,500 motorcyclists a year. However, what they did not tell you is that in 1984 5.5 million motorcycles were registered in the USA. Compare that to the 7 million registered motorcycles in 2010. That's 1.5 million more motorcycles and the same amount of fatalities.

Source: National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) Fatality Analysis Reporting System (FARS) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) Highway Statistics. Both the GAO and the GHSA are pushing for what they believe is the silver bullet of motorcycle safety, the mandatory helmet law.

Proper riding gear should be left to the rider, not the government. When you look at States like Tennessee and Arizona that have roughly the same size population and then break down fatality numbers it becomes clear that helmet laws do not have significant influence. Tennessee has a mandatory helmet law and 121 fatalities for 2010. Arizona has no mandatory helmet law and had 88 fatalities for the same period of time. Even right over the border from Tennessee their neighboring Kentucky, which also has no mandatory helmet law, had just 87 fatalities in 2010.

Another area where the Government agencies continue to overlook when dealing with motorcycle safety is rider education. If we cannot teach people to ride motorcycles we will have more and more fatalities.

Take New Hampshire for example. According to Robert LeTourneau, New Hampshire State

Official Motorcycle Education Specialist they have had 15 fatal motorcycle accidents of riders who took the class since 1990. That's out of over 44,000 students trained in the same time period and .034% of fatal motorcycle accidents. All with no mandatory helmet law.

While mandatory helmet laws look good on paper they rarely work in the real world. The best approach to motorcycle safety is and will always be rider education and awareness campaigns. Teaching people how to ride a motorcycle in the proper way and educating the general public to look for motorcycles, which can only benefit pedestrians and bicyclists as well, will avoid crashes and save lives.

POWERFUL POST-HOLIDAY WEIGHT-LOSS SOUP

1 Tbs. extra-virgin olive oil

1 onion diced

5 cloves garlic minced

32oz. chicken, vegetable or beef broth

4 cups of water

4 cups mixed vegetables(to include two vegetables from this list: mushrooms, okra, kale, zucchini, bok choy, artichoke hearts and broccoli. Then add your favorites such as carrots, celery, peppers, tomatoes etc.

Seasoning mix: 1 bay leaf, 1 tsp dried thyme, 2 tsp sea salt, 1/2 tsp dried red pepper flakes, 1/2 tsp cayenne pepper.

1 lb cooked protein such as leftover turkey or ham, shredded chicken breast, shrimp or tofu

1 cup cooked starch such as beans brown rice, quinoa, whole wheat orzo or any pasta.

1/2 cup chopped fresh flat leaf parsley(or any fresh herb, mint, cilantro or basil)

Lemon wedges.

In a large pot, heat oil. Add onion & saute until softened, about 5 minutes. Add garlic and saute until fragrant, about 1 minute. Add broth, water, vegetables & seasoning mix. Bring to a boil- reduce heat, cover and simmer for about 20 minutes. Add protein and starch, and simmer for 10 more minutes. Remove bay leaf. Stir in fresh parsley. Season soup with salt & pepper to taste. Ladle into bowls & spritz with lemon juice & serve...

The following brackets are the ones we keep here at the house for our MARC members. These are not sold by MARC..

PTT Button Bracket

Fits under the left handlebar module and positions the button so it is right where your left thumb is naturally under the left hand grip. Fits 1500 and 1800 Gold Wings and some other Honda models. Has been adapted to some other brands and models. Black anodized or plain aluminum available. Has standard 1/2" hole for PTT button. Price \$10.00

PTT Waterproof Button

Has large rounded surface for your thumb, so your thumb does not get tired or sore with heavy use. Black in color. Fits in 1/2" hole on PTT Button Bracket. Price \$13.00

Antenna Bracket For 1/2" Tubular Trunk Racks

Natural aluminum color only. Fits coax with SO-239 fitting only for antennas with PL-259 fittings, can not be modified to use with NMO fittings. Price \$25.00

Antenna Bracket For Kuryakyn or American Flat Racks For The 1800 Gold Wings.
