

From The President's Desk

Spring 2013 is here. I hope the gods of gasoline \$\$\$\$ will be kind to all of us. We have a lot of riding/driving to do in the next few weeks: our monthly meeting on 13 April and an event to work each of the next three weekends. And on 11 May our monthly meeting again. Don't forget that the May meeting will be our anniversary meeting so we will have some special prizes for all on the table. Be prepared to buy a few extra pink tickets from John, KC6ZOZ.

Did I mention the three events this month? I need your help! MARC needs motorcycles, SAG vehicles, and Net Control operators for all three events. Please volunteer to help with one or all of these rides. Even if you can only work part of the day I am sure that our coordinators can find a slot for you. Any and all help is greatly appreciated by everyone involved in each of these charity fund raisers.

I would be remiss if I did not remind everyone to check their motor/vehicle to make sure that everything is in ship shape and ready to go. Also I must remind everyone to wear proper safety gear when riding. If we (you) go through the Marine base on the Tour de OC you must have long sleeves, full length pants (no shorts), over the ankle hard soled shoes and full finger gloves. That is their requirement. The Marine Corps no longer requires the reflective vest but MARC does. It is for your safety and to identify you as a MARC rider to the bicyclists riding in the event. It is also time to remind everyone that we in MARC cannot allow anyone (event staff or participant) from the events we work to be a passenger on our motors. Only if a passenger comes with you to the event may ride as a passenger on your motor. This is a

serious liability for MARC and we must stand by this requirement.

The weather man has been very kind to those of us who live here in Southern California this winter. Except for some wind in the Inland Empire, we have had fairly good riding weather all winter. I hope that it dries out and warms up quickly for our MARC members and friends who live in the East and up in the Great White North. If you go on a ride/drive this spring or summer, please take notes and jot down a ride summary then send it to Bonnie, KD6OFQ, so she can publish it here in our newsletter. It is always nice to read about your adventures and perhaps plan a similar ride.

It was with great sorrow that we heard of the passing of Mike Z, KE6KWQ. Mike was a long time MARC member and will be missed. God be with you Mike, now a silent key.

Mijo and I hope that everyone had a Happy Easter and that the Bunny was generous to all. We had breakfast with our son, daughter-in-law, and grand-daughter then moved to our daughter's in-laws for an Easter feast with the family. We hope that everyone in MARC had a very good day with family and friends.

Mijo and I passed the month of March going to doctor appointments, baby sitting the grand daughter and prepping the garden for the spring and summer growing season. FROM THE CHAIRMAN'S DESK

MARC business first:

Tuesday April 2nd, attended the funeral for former MARC member Mike Zimbalist KE6KWQSK. May he now rest in peace and pain free.

Saturday, April 13, 2013 is our next MARC meeting at the **HomeTown Buffet**. All you can eat for \$8, what a deal. The one time a month we get to forget our diets and pig out. Go for it. Besides, we have many charity events coming up this month and need more ham radio equipped motorcycles and net control operators to really give these national recognized charity organizations the kind of support they really need to be successful. For me personally, I dislike all of these charity events pushed into one month, but it does get them out of the way in a short time.

Saturday April 20th, is the **San Diego Tour de Cure for the American Diabetes Assoc.** We go down on Friday the 19th and set up most of Net control and stay at the Marriott hotel, near the start of the event, and be on site at about 5am for the rest of the set up on Saturday morning and be ready for the 7am start of the bicycle charity event. Sunday April 28th, is the **Ship to Shore**, again for the **American Diabetes Assoc.** one of the most fun charity events of the year that we volunteer for. It starts from the Queen Mary in Long Beach and it is the only day of the year that bicyclists are allowed to ride over the very long and high Vincent Thomas Bridge that spans much of the harbor. The City of Long Beach, the City of Los Angeles and San Pedro all help coordinate this very well attended bicycle charity event, so it is always very well supported by locals. Bicyclists come great distances to partake in this once a year event. Here again we need all the MARC motorcycles we can muster and more radio operators for the SAG and at net control.

Saturday & Sunday May 4th & 5th is the **2 day Orange County Tour de OC**. This 2 day event starts in Orange CO. and ends Sunday afternoon at Mission Bay in



San Diego. It will over night, Sat. night, in Carlsbad By The Sea. More information at the April MARC meeting.

Saturday May 11th is our annual MARC Anniversary Meeting. This meeting marks the **21st year of our MARC club existence**. 




