No sooner we were there. Hwy 59 had no traffic to slow us and the train tracks either. Parked the bikes and walked over to the slide.

"Cousin Tim I will take your picture as you come down that slide!" Marlene commanded.

"Ok.. i had my picture taker ready but was surprised how fast the plastic tube moved me! Picture alright, of the ground.

We sat on the square teeter totter. "I think your side is a leetle heavier than mine, Phil!"

Phil chuckled. "Well we are here to test these contraptions.. maybe we had better find a swing to sit on, eh?"

Karen and I knew that it didn't look good for them to come up. The secret was still safe!

I arrived home with the quilt for Karen. Darkness had come and she was coming out to lock the back door of the garage. Instead she heard the BMW coming up the alley and opened the big garage door. I backed the Beemer in.. "Karen, OH Karen!"

1. Four size Large non-latex gloves
2. Blunt-nose scissors to cut clothing/bandages (get the best you can afford - they need to work)
3. Tweezers
4. Sterile gauze pads (4 x 4 in.)
5. Roller bandage (3-inch-wide elastic/4-inch-wide stretchy gauze)
6. Antiseptic wipe packets/neosporin
7. Adhesive cloth or plastic tape
8. Adhesive bandages (assorted sizes)
9. Surgical/compress dressing (big, absorbent, cuttable)
10. Tongue depressors (finger splints!)
11. CPR barrier (look for an Ambu Res-Cue Key CPR Mask)
12. Tourniquet

He mentions that "the last item may sound somewhat extreme, but if you are out there and face trying to control a serious bleeding situation for which other methods have failed, a tourniquet may be the one thing that saves a life."

He also mentions one other critical item: "Get training so you understand how and when serious interventions may be necessary." I think this one is the most important of all. You can improvise with a lot of things (sleeve of a sweater can make a tourniquet or pressure bandage, etc.) but if you don't know what to do in the first place, you might as well not have any of this stuff.

I would add one other critical item: water. I always carry at least a liter of water with me, more if it's hot and I'm going to be thirsty. You can cleanse wounds, fend off dehydration, and more.
