MINNESOTA RIDING

My last day for this job was October 31. I had been praying for an opening in the weather to ride down to Texas to see my nephew Justin. As the week progresses I would watch the web and type in Kansas City or Oklahoma City to see if it was still raining. Had thought of asking for the last day of work off. However the rains kept coming through the midsection of the nation.

"What are you doing?" Either friends or fellow workers would look at me and say that question. "You don't live in the south to ride in November!" Still I kept thinking it would be nice to see Justin and his 2 kids.

Halloween the air was crisp as kids hit the door bell. Famous words "Trick or Treat" rang out. Karen handed the goodies out while the Moms were out on the side walk. "No tricks please." Karen laughed and the Mothers would wave and nod.

I kept busy packing what I needed. No Givi top box so I found a canvas duffel bag to stuff a few extra things in. "You're packed?" Karen's in her easy chair watching the TV. I waited for her to get up to give her a hug and a kiss. "Well goodbye and goodnight, Tim!"

"In that order?" I gave her a warm hug.
"No. Call me when you get there!" I nodded

I was up at 3:15 after waking an hour earlier. Opened the garage door and walked slowly down the steps into the darkness. Rolled the BMW out on the driveway. Checked the stuff and realized no stocking cap... You do know its hard to walk quietly into the house! Found one in the basement where I had left it of course! Back to the machine sitting on its side stand.

Warning light for the tail light went off, but the rear brake light was on! Turned off the engine after putting down the side stand. Wiggled the rear brake switch on the rear brake arm. The brake light went out when warning light and touching the front and rear brake. Rolled down the alley to 37th and headed west down the same back roads I had used for the last 2 months of work.

South on I-35. Left at 4 am from home. Coolness was interrupted with the electric vest switched on. Heated grips felt warm under the mitts. Droned along waiting for the dawn to appear. Finally south of the Iowa border the last Friday of Daylight Savings the Sun came up.

"Maybe the Sunshine will start warming me?" I muttered in my helmet. The fall colors are more orange here in Iowa. Harvested fields dotted the landscape with some fields needing the corn to be removed. Winds came from the west. I noticed the lack of cars on the highways. People hunkering down for winter already?

Added another load of fuel in Missouri. Following I-35 through Kansas City instead of taking the 435 loop. Warning of road construction kept the traffic rolling on the outside loop. Filled fuel again in Kansas. Timing on filling only once per state was working.

Mileage jumped from 40 to 45-47 miles per gallon. Oxygenated fuel in the Midwest was replaced with other grades? Usual

mileage I get is 47 at 70mph. Emporia Kansas and the toll way. Can you understand why people follow you into one of the stalls as they were all open. I stuffed the ticket within my glove and rolled the throttle to get going again! Wanted to put that ticket in the pocket on my right sleeve for safe keeping. NOPE.

Finally stopped at an Oasis for brunch. 400+ miles left! Trees and bushes gave way to the prairie of Kansas. Oklahoma also has this vast scenery making me a small dot on the freeway. North of Oklahoma City I needed fuel. Sure... nothing on the west side of the freeway. Had to backtrack and get the fuel then .. yep no south entrance. Rode west a bit and found a southern road. Went by the Science Museum of OKC and finally south again on I-35.

Timing on these trips... 5 pm and we have heavy traffic! I kept at least one car length in front of me, idled along slipping the clutch and watching the traffic. One lane for I-35. Found the traffic starting to move faster. South of Norman I decided I had better eat. Lexington I exited to see a trooper, a Honda car and what looked to be a Ford Fusion in the ditch.. Rolled over. Figure the Honda Car must have bumped the Ford and it flipped or rolled down the embankment. I slowed of course, looking at the glass on the road and hoping for no flat!

Ate my McD's sandwich..Only to eat half of it. Stowed the rest of it in the saddle bag for later. Called Justin, "Which way, Fort Worth or Dallas?"

"NA SCAR is in Fort Worth, Uncle Tim. Dallas is better this time!"

"OK, Thanks!" I replied.

Darkness of Fall came as I took 35 E. Rode along with the traffic. Not too bad just making sure I was in whatever lane. Keeps moving the 35 E traffic from one side of the freeway to the other! But then I have done this before.

Finally take the Hwy 77 exit and down to Waxahachie or to Sandhurst Drive. The garage door was open. Justin's truck and car in the driveway with a few inches to spare on each side I rolled into his garage and shut off the BMW. Got it up on its Center Stand and looked over at the 91 BMW. Checked the odometer on it.. 145,000 miles... Mine had 142,000..

Justin came out, "Hello?" got the hug! We talked of the trip and what he is doing where he works. Mike and Kate came out and I shook Mike's hand as well as Kate's. They are supposedly adults now. Where did that time go? Used to come down and had to play 4 square or basketball with them!

Saturday we didn't do much. Justin drives truck during the week. Driving over 140,000 miles per year takes along time to wake up on the weekends! We did work on his BMW. The gauge lights don't work anymore. 6 years ago I had given him the LT. That same year the fuel hose had split causing a fire! We had redone the fuel injection harness but there was other things like the headlight and tail light that didn't get power anymore. He added that to the underside of the cross bar on this BMW. Blueish light emits and he can see how fast he is going. I added the safety bars to the engine.

"We can go for a ride on Sunday, Kate will be going with us!" "Ok." I replied.

Sunday we headed first to Church. The people in this small church showed their southern hospitality, shaking my hand and asking where I live... "Too Cold up there!" or "I have never been to Minnesota, I hear its cold!" The usual comments... sigh.

We headed back to Waxahachie to have lunch with Mike. He drove his Dad's pickup and we ate Mexican. Then we left for our token ride together. Straight roads with some curves. Green leaves and grass met my gaze. Following Justin with Kate on the back of his LT. Her brown pony tail dancing in the wind. 40 mile ride. I needed to find an inner tube for one of the kids in Justin's neighborhood had brought over his bike for me to fix on Saturday. Justin turned right, Kate waved as I waited at the light for the left turn arrow. Wal Mart had the tube, However the cheapy was no where on the shelf. Purchased the slime tube for \$12 and had to find the restroom! The Mexican food decided to well...

Arrived back at Justin's installed the rear inner tube and checked out the rest of the bicycile. "My Mom wants to pay you, Sir." I looked down at his brown eyes. "Bub, I want to do this for you. Save the money for something else." The kid nodded. "OK"

I was checking weather again. I wanted to see a friend who had moved from Minnesota to Arkansas. He and his wife moved 3 years ago. He had wanted me to stop by on one of my trips before. However the rains and snow storm was for casted on Tuesday. With the impression or hint from the Holy Spirit it seemed I should cancel that part of the trip and go home! Sent off a Face Book message to Denny and felt peace about going home. Justin was preparing the evening meal. His marriage had broken up last year and now he does all the house work on the weekends.

So whose praying for the supper?" I ask.

"I will." Justin bows his head and not only prays for the meal but my trip home. "No rain, Please Jesus!" We eat watching the NBC football game. I keep looking at the clock. The football game would take another hour..

"Well good bye to you all!" I shook hands with Mike and Katelynne, Justin gave me a hug. "Thanks for coming Uncle Tim, call me tomorrow?" I nodded. Set my alarm for 4 am. Then hit the pillow. 2 hours later I am awake... the impression or God was saying.. "Go" "But Lord, I need my beauty sleep!" I protest.. Finally I get up and dress.. then lay down. "GO! NOW"

Rolled the BMW out on the street. no rain and dry... Then get the helmet and push the door button to close the garage. Light sprinkles of rain are hitting the gas tank! Looked at the clock 12:30 am... Rode home.. Had some sprinkles around Dallas. For cast for Dallas was 2 to 4 inches of rain! Rode home

No rain on the way home. No hard rain that is! The window of going to Texas was closing!

I called Karen when getting into my garage.. "Where are you?" She is asking.

"Well I am unloading my stuff in the garage..."
